GSSNE's HERITAGE AWARD

Description

The Heritage Award recognizes the work done by a volunteer to promote the history of Girl Scouts through artifact preservation, restoration, sharing and/or presenting the history of the council and/or the entire Girl Scout movement.

Criteria

MEMBERSHIP: The candidate is a currently registered member of GSSNE in good standing and successfully completed all applicable training(s)
FOCUS: Service benefits at least one service unit or geographical area within council jurisdiction
LENGTH: A minimum of 5 years of service provided through 9/30 of this calendar year.

Nomination

NOMINATION: 1 from any GSSNE member
ENDORSEMENTS: 3 from individuals familiar with the candidate's service other than the nominator. At least one endorsement letter must be from an adult not related to the candidate.

Nominee Example

A volunteer who served as a GSSNE Museum docent, provided historical presentations on the Girl Scout movement, and shared photos, memorabilia, and artifacts with council. This volunteer has a solid knowledge and passion for all things Girl Scouts and continues to promote the movement's history.

A volunteer who has traveled numerous times to the birthplace of Girl Scouts, Savannah, Georgia. She has Girl Scout troops on trips to Savannah, can answer virtually any question about JGL, and encourages all Girl Scouts to learn about, celebrate and honor the traditions set forth by JGL.
